This "spring meeting" which is traditionally called "Journées Chevreul" will be held during 2 days in Paris as an AFECG-DGF joint meeting under the umbrella of EuroFedLipid.

This symposium will present and discuss the latest basis finding on the role of omega-3 (n-3) polyunsaturated fatty acids (PUFA) in the brain, with major questions:

- What positive roles can be presently attributed to n-3 PUFA in early life development, patho-physiology and prevention of brain diseases?
- What do we know from epidemiological studies on the role of lipid nutrition and PUFA intake on brain functions and human behaviour?

The last part of the meeting will focus on the scientific incoming efforts to provide n-3 LC-PUFA to human beings.

Internationally recognized Scientists in the field of essential fatty acids will focus on new discoveries, burning questions and latest knowledge. One of the highlights of these days will be the "Medaille Chevreul" lecture given by a leader in this scientific field: Dr S. Rapoport, Bethesda, USA, who will emphasize the recent developments of PUFA metabolism in Brain and liver and its interplay and regulation by the diet.

Health professionals, nutritionists, food scientists from academy and public institutions as well as food industrialists active on research, development and marketing will be interested by this conference. The venue will provide excellent networking facilities for delegates coming from different spheres of activity related to lipid nutrition and health effect.
